RECOGNITION OF OFFICER LARRY BAKER AS POLICE OFFICER OF THE YEAR FOR THE WESTERN DIVISION

Mayor Brundige presented Patrol Officer Baker with a plaque from the Tennessee Association of Chief's of Police for the 2006 Police Officer of the Year for the Western Division and ask Chief Moore to read the letter submitted to the Tennessee Association of Chief's of Police for the nomination of Patrol Officer Larry Baker as 2006 Western Division Patrol Officer of the year.

Chief Moore read the following letter:

Western Division Police Officer of the Year Award Nomination:

Ptl. Officer Larry Baker of the Martin Tennessee Police Department is nominated for the West Tennessee Region Police Officer of the Year. Larry is a career Police Officer with the City of Martin and at age 58, runs circles around the majority of officers in our department in attitude, work ethic, motivation, leadership, and professionalism. Larry has the unique gift of common sense, tough character, and compassion gelled together to form the exemplary Police Officer.

Ptl. Baker started with Martin P.D. in 1983 as the City's Codes Enforcement Officer when he was 35 years old. Larry worked hard as Code's Officer under the Direction of Chief Jackie Moore who often praised Larry for his willingness to perform duties others would shy away from or just couldn't accomplish.

In 1998, Ptl. Baker startled our Command Staff by sharing a desire to become a Police Officer after 15 years as Codes Enforcement Officer. When we discussed the rigors of the Police Academy and the shift work expected of our officers, he never checked up. Feeling that Larry had earned the right to pursue this dream, then Chief J.D. Sanders sent him to the academy where he performed exceptionally and became a very effective police officer and quickly gained the respect of his peers and commanders. During his tenure as patrol officer he was assigned a narcotics detection K-9 and trained with the dog diligently to become one of the best K-9 teams our department has ever had.

In 2003 as a new Chief of Police I had an opportunity to talk individually to each officer in the department about goals. When I met with Larry, he had been assigned permanent day shift for approximately one year out of respect for his years of service. His only request was to be reassigned to rotating shifts so he could pull his weight. His stock already high with me went with through the roof. His request was immediately granted and he hasn't slacked up since.

In the year 2005, Ptl. Larry Baker consistently records the highest statistics of anyone in the department in areas of self-initiated policing product. Don't misunderstand, Larry isn't a ticket hound, he just believes in working while he is on the clock. We have excellent supervisors but most are young. Larry leads by example and wisdom and many times provides support to young supervisors through his experience and levelheaded composure. Recently I suggested Larry consider processing for Lt. promotion at the next available opportunity. He kindly responded that he loves what he does and does not wish to be a supervisor. We aren't through with that discussion but the point is Ptl. Larry Baker is the example I hold up to young Police Officers to aspire to.

There is no defining moment in the past year that makes Ptl. Larry Baker deserving of the "Police Officer of the Year" award, there is an entire year, an entire career of Ptl. Larry Baker being an exemplary Officer that makes him deserving of that recognition.

Activities:

Larry is a very active member of the Martin Central Baptist Church, takes care of several elderly citizens in the community, participates in the Martin Citizen's Police Academy, K-9 training and public K-9 demonstrations, Summer YOUTH program, and many other community outreach programs.

INTRODUCTION AND PRESENTATION OF RESOLUTION R2006-15: RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING CITY RECORDER TO ROUND PROPERTY TAXES, INTERESTS AND PENALTIES

Mayor Brundige introduced and presented for consideration Resolution R2006-15: Resolution authorizing City Recorder to round property taxes, interests, and penalties.

Recorder Mathis read Resolution R2006-15. A copy follows:

RESOLUTION R2006-15

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING CITY RECORDER TO ROUND PROPERTY TAXES, INTERESTS AND PENALTIES

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 67-5-103(a) authorizes municipalities to levy an ad valorem tax upon all property subject to such tax; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 67-5-103(b) directs that the amount of such tax shall be fixed by the municipal legislative body of each municipality; and

WHEREAS, the rounding of ad valorem property tax amounts to the nearest dollar would simplify and expedite the payment and collection of property taxes in the city; and

WHEREAS, the rounding of property taxes, interests and penalties will not significantly impact the revenues of the City of Martin, Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, the rounding of property taxes, interests and penalties will be a convenience to city taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, the City of Martin Board of Mayor and Aldermen desires to authorize the office of the City of Martin City Recorder to round property taxes, interests and penalties to the nearest dollar; NOW

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the City of Martin Mayor and Board of Aldermen meeting in regular session on the 14th day of August 2006, that the office of the City of Martin City Recorder is hereby authorized to round individual ad valorem property tax amounts and delinquent interests and penalties to the nearest dollar. Such rounding shall be applied uniformly to all property tax bills in the city for real and personal property, whether such property is locally assessed or centrally assessed and shall be accomplished by rounding amounts ending in \$0.01 to \$0.49 down to the nearest dollar and amounts ending in \$0.50 to \$0.99 up to the nearest dollar. Such rounding shall apply to both the tax amount and any interest and penalty added to delinquent taxes.

THIS RESOLUTION SHALL be effective for the 2006 tax year and subsequent tax years, the public welfare requiring it.

INTRODUCTION AND PRESENTATION OF RESOLUTION R2006-16: INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT FOR EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS BETWEEN WEAKLEY COUNTY 911 EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS DISTRICT AND MARTIN POLICE DEPARTMENT

Mayor Brundige introduced and presented for consideration Resolution R2006-16: Interlocal Cooperation Agreement for Emergency Communications between Weakley County 911 Emergency Communications District and Martin Police Department.

Recorder Mathis read Resolution R2006-16. A copy follows:

RESOLUTION R2006-16

INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT FOR EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS BETWEEN WEAKLEY COUNTY 911 EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS DISTRICT AND MARTIN POLICE DEPARTMENT

Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. 7-86-105(b)(6), this Interlocal Cooperation Agreement for Emergency Communications (the "Agreement") is entered into between and among the City of Martin (the "Martin Police Department – in this draft shown as Martin PD",) a political subdivision of the State of Tennessee, and the Weakley County 911 Emergency Communications District (the "District"), a municipality and public corporation created and established pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. 7-86-101, *et seq*.

WHEREAS, the District was established for the purpose of providing a system of emergency communications whereby a caller dialing 911 would immediately be connected to a

public safety answering point that would quickly and efficiently assure that the appropriate emergency responders were notified; and

WHEREAS, such a system results in the saving of life, a reduction in the destruction of property, quicker apprehension of criminals and ultimately the saving of money; and

WHEREAS, the District was established as a statutory municipality or public corporation in perpetuity, authorized to fund its operations through a bona fide emergency telephone service charge on all service users within its borders, whether business or residential, public or private, profit making or not-for-profit, including government entities, and

WHEREAS, the Martin PD and the District desire to conduct certain operations related to emergency communications jointly as contemplated by Tenn. Code Ann. 7-86-105 (b)(6);

WHEREAS, the Weakley County 911 Board of Directors authorized the execution of this interlocal agreement between the Martin PD and the District by its Board action on August 22, 2006.

WHEREAS, the District, acting by and through its Board of Directors, authorized the execution of this interlocal agreement between the Martin PD and the District by its Board action on August 22, 2006.

WHEREAS, the City of Martin Board of Mayor and Aldermen authorized the execution of this interlocal agreement between the Martin PD and the District by its Board action on August 15, 2006.

WHEREAS, the Martin Police Department, acting by and through its Board of Mayor and Aldermen, authorized the execution of this interlocal agreement between the Martin PD and the District by its Board action on August 15, 2006.

1. Purpose. This Agreement is for the purpose of establishing the manner, terms and conditions by which the Martin PD and the District shall jointly provide 911 service in the District. For purposes of this agreement "911 service" means 911 service and wireless enhanced 911 service as those terms are defined in Tenn. Code Ann. 7-86-103.

2. Cooperative Agreement. The parties agree to jointly provide 911 service in the District.

The District hereby agrees to be responsible for providing the following operational aspects, including funding, of 911 service within the City of Martin:

Managing the MSAG/911 database; performing addressing-mapping GIS services for residences located outside municipalities, providing and maintaining 911 controllers, GIS mapping software, and provision and maintenance of CAD software.

The Martin PD hereby agrees to be responsible for providing the following operational aspects, including funding, of 911 service within the City of Martin:

Performing addressing-mapping GIS services for residences located within the City of Martin, providing facility space and maintenance; performing dispatching and calltaking; providing telephone system, generator, logging recorder, UPS, radios, PSAP furniture, computer equipment, and a PSAP Manager to manage operations.

The parties hereby acknowledge that, consistent with Tenn. Code Ann. 7-86-306(a)(1), reimbursements by the Tennessee Emergency Communications Board are subject to availability of funds.

3. State and Federal Compliance. The Parties hereby agree to fully comply with the applicable Polices, Orders, Regulations and Revenue and Operational Standards of the Tennessee Emergency Communications Board, the applicable rules, regulations and orders of the Federal Communications Commission and applicable federal and state laws in the performance of this agreement.

4. Nondiscrimination. The parties hereby agree, warrant and assure that no person shall be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination in the performance of this agreement on the grounds of disability, age, race, color, religion, national origin, or any other classification protected by federal, Tennessee state constitutional or statutory law.

5. Term. The parties hereby agree that this agreement shall continue until terminated by one of the parties, each party having the right to terminate the agreement upon written notice of 120 days. The notice shall be submitted by certified mail to each active member of the Weakley County Emergency Communications Board of Directors and to each active member of the City of Martin Board of Mayor and Alderman.

ACCEPT BIDS FOR 2006-2007 ASPHALT SURFACING PROGRAM FROM FORD CONSTRUCTION: PRIMARY BID; TDOT SPEC 411-D IN PLACE, OF \$62.50 PER TON FOR ONE YEAR OR ALTERNATE BID; \$65.50 PER TON, TDOT SPEC 411-E IN PLACE, FOR ONE YEAR

Mayor Brundige presented the bids for 2006-2007 Asphalt Surfacing Program from Ford Construction: Primary Bid; TDOT SPEC 411-D in place, of \$62.50 per ton for one year or Alternate Bid; \$65.50 per ton, TDOT SPEC 411-E in place, for one year. The second bid from Martin Paving was for blacktopping four streets only, not a year contract which we requested. Ford Construction meets our specs, therefore we recommend the bid from Ford Construction. The contract started in July if we accept this bid.

ORDINANCE O2006-07

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY OF MARTIN MUNICIPAL CODE, TITLE 16; STREETS AND SIDEWALKS, ETC.; CHAPTER 1, MISCELLANEOUS REGARDING INTERFERING WITH A FUNERAL OR BURIAL.

- WHEREAS, Section 6-2-201(22) of <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u> authorizes the City of Martin to exercise general police powers and to define, prohibit, abate, suppress, prevent and regulate acts, practices and conduct and all other things whatsoever detrimental, or liable to be detrimental, to the health, morals, comfort, safety, convenience or welfare of its inhabitants; and
- WHEREAS, <u>*Tennessee Code Annotated*</u>, Section 39-17-317 makes it a class C misdemeanor for interfering with a funeral or burial, funeral home viewing of a deceased person, funeral procession, or funeral or memorial service for a deceased person; and
- WHEREAS, the chief legislative body of the City of Martin held a public hearing to obtain citizen input into of the said amendment.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Martin that:

Section 1. The City of Martin Municipal Code, Title 16, STREETS AND SIDEWALKS, ETC.; Chapter 1, Miscellaneous by inserting the following as 16-111, <u>Interfering with a funeral or</u> burial and re-numbering the remaining sections in succession:

16-111. <u>Interfering with a funeral or burial</u>. No person or group of persons may interfere with a funeral or burial, funeral home viewing of a deceased person, funeral procession, or funeral or memorial service for a deceased person. Any person who does one or more of the following within 500 feet of a funeral, burial, viewing, funeral procession, or memorial service for a deceased person would commit the offense: (1) acts or obstruct or interfere with any such commemorative service; (2) makes an offensive utterance, gesture, or display; or (3) pickets, protests, or demonstrates at a funeral, funeral procession or memorial service. For clarification purposes this section prohibits any act or acts designed to obstruct or interfere with a commemorative service by making any

utterance, gesture, or display in a manner that would offend an ordinary person. Commission of this offense shall be classified as a Class C misdemeanor.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect from and after its final passage, the public welfare of the City of Martin requiring it.
