Mayor Brundige introduced and presented for consideration the second and final reading and public hearing of Ordinance O2010-01: An ordinance to amend the City of Martin Stormwater Ordinance (O2004-15) regarding the administering and enforcement entity. This was published in the Weakley County press on March 25, 2010.

Recorder Mathis read Ordinance O2010-01. A copy was available for any interested persons and members of the press. A copy of O2010-01 follows:

ORDINANCE 02010-01

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CITY OF MARTIN STORMWATER ORDINANCE (02004-15) REGARDING THE ADMINISTERING AND ENFORCEMENT ENTITY

- **WHEREAS,** pursuant to *Tennessee Code Annotated*, Section 68-221-1105, the City of Martin has adopted a Stormwater Ordinance; and
- **WHEREAS**, the City of Martin Board of Mayor and Aldermen has deemed this amendment to be necessary for the welfare of the residents and property owners thereof this City as a whole; and
- **WHEREAS**, the City of Martin Board of Mayor and Aldermen has held a public hearing for the purpose of receiving public comment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MARTIN BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN:

- Section 1. That the administering and enforcement entity for the provisions of the Stormwater Ordinance (O2004-15) shall be the Stormwater Director as appointed by the City of Martin Board of Mayor and Aldermen.
- Section 2. That all references to the person having charge in the administering and enforcement of the Stormwater Ordinance (O2004-15) are changed to read "Stormwater Director."
- Section 3. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage, after second and final reading, THE PUBLIC WELFARE REQUIRING IT.
