INTRODUCTION AND PRESENTATION FOR CONSIDERATION THE FIRST READING OF ORDINANCE O2012-06: AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MARTIN, TENNESSEE, ADOPTING THE ANNUAL BUDGET AND ESTABLISHING A PROPERTY TAX RATE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2013

Mayor Brundige introduced and presented for consideration the first reading Ordinance O2012-06: An ordinance of the City of Martin, Tennessee, adopting the annual budget and establishing a property tax rate for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013.

Recorder Mathis read Resolution R2012-06. A copy was made available for any interested citizens and the members of the media. A copy follows:

ORDINANCE O2012-06

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MARTIN, TENNESSEE ADOPTING THE ANNUAL BUDGET AND ESTABLISHING A PROPERTY TAX RATE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2012 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2013

WHEREAS, *Tennessee Code Annotated* Title 9 Chapter 1 Section 116 requires that all funds of the State of Tennessee and all its political subdivisions shall first be appropriated before being expended and that only funds that are available shall be appropriated; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Budget Law of 1982 requires that the governmental body of each municipality adopt and operate under an annual budget ordinance presenting a financial plan with at least the information required by state statute, that no municipality may expend any moneys regardless of the source except in accordance with a budget ordinance and that the governing body shall not make any appropriations in excess of estimated available funds; and

WHEREAS, the governing body has published the annual operating budget and budgetary comparisons of the proposed budget with the prior year (actual) and the current year (estimated) in a newspaper of general circulation not less than ten (10) days prior to the meeting where the governing body will consider final passage of the budget.

SECTION 1. NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of Martin, Tennessee, assembled in special session on the 28th day of August, 2012 that the amounts hereafter set out are hereby appropriated for the purpose of meeting the expenses of the various funds of MARTIN, TENNESSEE, for capital projects and for meeting the payment of principal and interest on the City's debts maturing during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012, and ending June 30, 2013, according to the following schedule:

General Fund Expenditures (Including debt payments)	\$ 7,909,144
State Street Aid Fund Expenditures	233,500
Library Gift Fund Expenditures	41,000
Cemetery Fund Expenditures	31,850
Drug Enforcement Fund Expenditures	27,700
Solid Waste Fund	1,327,968
Water and Sewer Fund	2,878,223
Natural Gas Fund	3,671,184

SECTION 2. **BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that expenditures in excess of the above may be made only with an appropriate ordinance amending this ordinance. Such action shall include a statement as to the source of revenue to finance the proposed expenditures.

SECTION 3. **BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, there is hereby levied a property tax of \$1.4772 per \$100.00 of assessed value on all real and personal property.

SECTION 4. **BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that all unencumbered balances of appropriations remaining at the end of the fiscal year shall lapse and revert to the respective fund balances.

SECTION 5. **BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a detailed financial plan will be attached to this budget and become part of this budget ordinance. In addition, the published operating budget and budgetary comparisons shown by fund with beginning and ending fund balances will be attached.

SECTION 6. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage, after second and final reading, THE PUBLIC WELFARE REQUIRING IT.

RESOLUTION R2012-09

RESOLUTION MAKING APPROPRIATIONS TO CERTAIN NON-PROFIT CHARITABLE ORGANIZATIONS, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2012 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2013

WHEREAS, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen for the City of Martin, Tennessee, has determined that it would benefit the general welfare of the residents of Martin if appropriations were made to certain non-profit charitable organizations: and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated 6-54-111 allows the legislative body of a municipality to appropriate funds under certain conditions for non-profit charitable organizations

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen for the City of Martin, that

- **SECTION 1**. a. One thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) be appropriated to the Kiwanis Club for the Annual Christmas parade.
 - b. Two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) be appropriated to Community Developmental Services, Inc.
 - c. Twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) be appropriated for the community activity Tennessee Soybean Festival
 - d. One thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00) appropriated to the Exchange Club Carl Perkins Center for Prevention of Child Abuse
 - e. Two thousand seven hundred fifty dollars (\$2,750.00) be appropriated to the Miss Tennessee Soybean Scholarship.
 - f. Five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) be appropriated to the Weakley County Reading Railroad.
 - g. Two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) be appropriated to the American Cancer Society relay for Life.
- **SECTION 2**. In accordance with T.C.A. 6-65-111, this appropriation is made on the condition that the non-profit charitable organization for which these funds are appropriated shall file with the City Recorder's office a copy of an annual report of its business and transactions, which includes, but is not limited to, a copy of an annual audit, its programs which serve the residents of the City of Martin and the proposed use of the municipal assistance. The City Recorder shall consult with appropriate officials of the organization and auditors for the City to determine the extent of the information which shall satisfy the requirement of this section.

SECTION 3. It is the expressed intent of the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Martin in making this appropriation to be fully in compliance with T.C.A. 6-54-111 and Chapter 0380-3-7 of the Rules of the Comptroller of the Treasury, State of Tennessee.

SECTION 4. This resolution shall take effect upon its passage, THE PUBLIC WELFARE REQUIRING IT.
